for Entry of Jewellery Alloy into Registry of Registered Alloys

INFORMATION on Registration of Jewellery Alloys (valid from 1.1.2004)

The application for the registration of the jewellery alloy may be filed by the manufacturer or the trader registered by the Assay Office pursuant to § 35 Hallmarking Act No. 539/92 Coll. (hereinafter referred to as the Hallmarking Act). The form of the Application may be collected at every branch office of the Assay Office and sent with CZK 400,- duty stamp (item 61 d in Annex to Act No. 368/1992 Coll., on Administrative Fees as amended by the subsequent regulations) to the address:

The jewellery alloy to be entered into the Registry must comply with the following conditions:

- compliance with the authorised standard of fineness (§ 5 Hallmarking Act) – apart from the basic precious metal, it may contain only the metals the utilisation of which is permitted by § 9 Decree 364/2003 Coll., i.e.:

as for the alloy of **gold**

- silver, copper, zinc, manganese, nickel, iron or palladium

as for the alloy of **silver**, only copper

as for the alloy of **platinum**

- palladium, gold, copper, wolfram, nickel or cobalt;

- the metals with the content of up to 3/1000 are not taken into account

- in justified cases, the Assay Office may provide for the exemption

- the alloy must be chemically tested by the Assay Office or by the person or organisation authorised by the Assay Office

- the applicant is obliged to allow the Assay Office for the purchase of the amount of the

alloy

The alloy sample for the performance of the control analysis (ca 2 g) and 60 g for making-up the testing instruments may be submitted by the applicant at every branch office of the Assay Office which shall then present the sample to OZLT PÚ Praha. In the event that the Assay Office does not perform the entry of the jewellery alloy into the Registry, it shall return the alloy, sample and proper fractions to the applicant after the performance of the analysis. In the event that the alloy is entered into the Registry, the Assay Office shall keep the alloy against the payment for making-up the testing instruments.

The decision on the entry of the jewellery alloy is to be approved by the Director of the Assay Office.
